

# DIA 2014 50<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL MEETING CALL FOR STUDENT POSTERS

DEADLINE TO SUBMIT ABSTRACT IS MONDAY, MARCH, 24, 2014.

The DIA welcomes abstract submissions for the Student Poster Program at the DIA 2014 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting. The theme of the meeting is “Celebrate the Past - Invent the Future”.



The Student Poster Program is an opportunity for eligible students to present research results to a diverse group of scientific professionals who are actively involved in the discovery, development, and life cycle management of pharmaceuticals, biotechnology, medical devices, and healthcare related products.

**A maximum of 20 abstracts will be selected for the Student Poster Program.**

Selected student poster presenters will receive:

- One complimentary meeting registration to attend the DIA 2014 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting for one listed author
- A maximum of three nights' hotel accommodations (room and tax only) at the DIA assigned hotel
- One round trip, coach airline ticket to San Diego, CA
- Up to \$50 per day reimbursement for meeting-related expenses for a maximum of three days
- Accepted abstracts will also be printed in the final program and will be posted on the DIA 2014 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting website
- One-year student membership to DIA

Accepted abstracts will be published in the Annual Meeting Final Program, posted on the DIA 2014 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting website and in the July 2014 issue of the *The Journal of Therapeutic Innovation & Regulatory Science* (TIRS), DIA's scholarly peer reviewed publication, which is distributed to all members of DIA.

## STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

- Individuals must be an undergraduate or graduate student who can document that they are enrolled in a Bachelor's, Master's, Pharm. D and Ph. D or equivalent degree-granting or certificate-granting academic program in an accredited academic institution, whose content is consistent with the mission of DIA.
- Students must be completing at least 12 undergraduate hours or 9 graduate hours annually in their academic program.
- The presented research must have been conducted at an academic institution.
- Persons who completed a degree in the 2013 academic year may submit a student poster by providing documentation that they were a student when the research was performed.
- Fellows, residents, post-doctoral scholars, and professionals are not eligible; however, they are invited to submit to the DIA 2014 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting Professional Poster Program.
- All submitting authors must return a student verification form to [annualmeetingprogram@diahome.org](mailto:annualmeetingprogram@diahome.org) by the submission deadline as part of their application. **Abstracts submitted without a student verification form will not be considered.**
- Past DIA Annual Meeting or EuroMeeting student poster presenters are ineligible.

## GENERAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Abstracts must be submitted through the DIA website ([www.diahome.org](http://www.diahome.org)) by **Monday, March 24, 2014**.
2. A student may submit only one abstract.
3. Abstracts may not refer to specific brand names.
4. Abstracts will be reviewed, and authors notified of results during the week of Monday, April 14, 2014.
5. The theme of DIA 2014 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting is “Celebrate the Past - Invent the Future”. Abstracts should address one of the interest areas (see next page) represented at DIA 2014 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting.
6. If an abstract is accepted, one author or coauthor must attend the DIA 2014 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting to present the abstract during the Student Poster Program on Monday, June 16. DIA grants authors permission to publish their abstracts after it appears in the *The Journal of Therapeutic Innovation & Regulatory Science* (TIRS), provided the publication includes a credit line indicating that your abstract was first published in the TIRS and specifying the volume and issue numbers (volume 47, issue 4).
7. Only one author is to be identified at the time of submitting the abstract. This author will be the lead regarding all communications related to the submission. Additional authors may be added after the review process is complete.

## ONSITE REQUIREMENTS

- The attending author or coauthor is expected to be present at the DIA Student Forum. *Date and time to be announced shortly.*
- Student Poster Program will be held on **Monday, June 16, 2014.**
- Presenters must prepare a poster for onsite presentation.
- Each author will be scheduled for a 2- to 3-minute presentation of their work, including questions and answers from the judges; therefore, attendance at DIA 2014 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting is required. Student presentation of posters must be autonomous.
- Students will be required to attend Annual Meeting educational offerings and submit writeups of the educational offerings for possible publication.

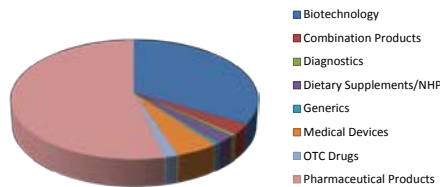
## REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION FOR ALL ABSTRACTS

### Participant Disclosure Information

All abstract authors must disclose any significant financial interest or other relationship with the manufacturer(s) of any commercial product(s) and/or providers of commercial services discussed in an educational presentation, as well as any discussion of unlabeled or unapproved drugs or devices. If you are proposing an abstract on behalf of the author, as the submitter you will not be asked to disclose. However, should the abstract be accepted, the author will be informed that he/she must respond to the Participant Disclosure to participate in the Annual Meeting Program.

- Content delivered at the DIA Annual Meeting is distributed. All submitters and authors must agree to the DIA Speaker Authorization for Use of Presentation Materials in order for the abstract to be a part of the Annual Meeting Program.

If you are submitting your own abstract, you are considered the AUTHOR and will be the direct contact for this abstract.*

**Method\* (Maximum 300 characters including spaces)** *When, where, and how was the study was done? What materials were used or who was included in the study?*

**REQUIRED FIELD (TO BE SUBMITTED ONLINE)**

**Results\* (Maximum 2000 characters including spaces)** *What quantitative data was collected; what answer was found to the research question; what did the study find? Was the tested hypothesis true?*

**REQUIRED FIELD (TO BE SUBMITTED ONLINE)**

**Conclusion\* (Maximum 2000 characters including spaces)** *State what can be concluded from the study and its implications.*

**Abstracts will be reviewed, and authors will be notified of results the week of April 14, 2014.**
