Defining Community Round Table Discussions




Community Round Table Discussions are designed to carry learning and debate from sessions to real-life application and discussion.

- Introduce the session and welcome any session participants (chair/speakers) if they were able to attend.

Minutes

- Facilitate an open discussion. Facilitators should be prepared to open the discussion by posing the first question to the audience or framing a discussion point to start with.

The goal is to have a meaningful discussion around the topic of the corresponding session

Community Round Table Discussion Planning Notes

- All Community Round Table nominations must be submitted by a member of a DIA Community. Nominations by non-members will not be considered. Not a member? [Visit here to join a community.](#)
- Community Round Table Discussions will be held in the Community Zone. The Community Zone will have two large discussions areas set with approximately 40 chairs (campfire style).
- The Community Round Table Discussion will have a silent PA system where attendees can wear headsets to hear one another better. A roving AV tech will oversee the sound quality.
- Community Round Tables Discussions focus only on active discussion and do not utilize PowerPoint presentations or other visual aids.
