Organizing Your Session: Formula for Success

Take 5-10 minutes to frame your session. What is the group going to do over the next 45-60 minutes?



Plan for 30-35 minutes of dedicated small group discussion (breakout groups)



Use the last 20 minutes for sharing and open discussion.
