



### CALL FOR STUDENT POSTERS

Deadline to submit: February 13

The Student Poster Program is an opportunity for eligible students to present research results to a diverse group of scientific professionals who are actively involved in the discovery, development, and lifecycle management of pharmaceuticals, biotechnology, medical devices, and healthcare-related products.

The DIA 2020 Global Annual Meeting Poster Session will highlight original research, innovation, and best practices in these four strategic content areas: translational science and medicine, regulatory science, value and access, and patient engagement.

#### ACCEPTED PRESENTERS WILL RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING:

- A display board in the designated poster networking area onsite
- Posting of abstract on the DIA 2020 website

*Please note: Accepted poster presenters who do not receive a travel award will have to register at the student rate in order to present at the meeting.*

#### TOP 5 REASONS TO PRESENT YOUR POSTER AT DIA 2020

1. Posters allow you to get feedback on ongoing research. Whether your work is in its early stages or completed, you will benefit from discussions with other researchers in the same field.

#### STUDENT POSTER TRAVEL AWARD

All accepted posters will be eligible for the Student Poster Travel Award. The Program Committee will select up to 20 poster authors to receive:

- One complimentary meeting registration to attend DIA 2020 for one listed author
- A maximum of three nights' hotel accommodations (room and tax only) at the DIA assigned hotel
- One round trip, coach airline ticket to Washington, DC
- Up to \$50 per day reimbursement for meeting-related expenses for a maximum of three days
- One year student membership to DIA

Note: Student Poster Travel Award winners must present their work orally from the podium. Presenters will be given five minutes to deliver their work in a PowerPoint template provided by DIA. Award winners should be prepared to answer questions from the judges and audience.

**Program Committee members will select the top three oral presentations and those posters will be highlighted in an electronic post-event publication distributed to all attendees.**

2. Network with fellow attendees and have an impartial discussion of your work with people from around the globe, across the drug development continuum.
3. Posters are a great way to disseminate your work, especially if it falls within a narrow field of specialization.
4. If your field of research is not featured prominently in our program, a poster is a great way to bring your content to a wide, interdisciplinary audience.
5. Gain the skills and confidence to present your work in a dynamic fashion to an audience of your peers.

## STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

- Students must be enrolled at the time of the event or have graduated within three months of the event date.
- Students must provide documentation of enrollment of at least 12 undergraduate hours or 9 graduate hours annually in a degree or certificate-granting academic program in an accredited academic institution, whose content is consistent with the mission of DIA.
- The presented research must have been conducted with an academic institution.
- The only item that will display on the company area on your badge will be your academic institution.
- All submitting authors must complete a student verification form by the submission deadline as part of their application. **Abstracts submitted without a student verification form will not be considered.**
- Fellows, residents, post-doctoral scholars, students who are employed full-time, and working professionals are not eligible; however, they are invited and encouraged to submit to the DIA 2020 Professional Poster Program.
- Past DIA Annual Meeting or DIA Europe student poster presenters are NOT eligible to receive the travel award.
- Abstracts submitted for presentation must not have been presented or published previously.

## GENERAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Abstracts must be submitted online at [DIAGlobal.org/Abstracts](https://DIAGlobal.org/Abstracts).
- A student can submit more than one abstract but may only represent one poster onsite. Co-authors are welcome to register for the meeting and present subsequent poster.
- Abstracts may not refer to specific brand names.

• Abstracts should address one of the interest areas represented at DIA 2020.

- If an abstract is accepted, one author or co-author must attend DIA 2020 to present the abstract during the Student Poster Program on Monday, June 15.
- Only one author is to be identified at the time of submitting the abstract. This author will be the lead regarding all communications related to the submission.

## ONSITE REQUIREMENTS

- Presenters must prepare a poster for onsite presentation.
- Each student author selected to receive a travel award for their participation will be scheduled for a five minute oral podium presentation to include Q&A with the audience; therefore, attendance at DIA 2020 is required.

## REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION FOR ALL ABSTRACTS

### • Participant Disclosure Information

All abstract authors must disclose any significant financial interest or other relationship with the manufacturer(s) of any commercial product(s) and/or providers of commercial services discussed in an educational presentation, as well as any discussion of unlabeled or unapproved use of drugs or devices.

- All authors must agree to the DIA Speaker Authorization for Use of Presentation Materials in order for the abstract to be a part of the Annual Meeting Program. Accepted posters will be available on the DIA 2020 website for attendee download.

### REQUIRED FIELDS (TO BE SUBMITTED ONLINE)

**Abstract Title\*** (**125 characters including spaces**) Titles should briefly describe the focus of the abstract as well as accurately reflect the content of the abstract.

**Core Interest Area/Track\*** Select the track that suits your poster's subject/topic.

**Keyword\*** (**Maximum 100 characters including spaces**) Provide one or more keywords to associate with your abstract. These will be used for search purposes should your abstract be selected as a poster. Examples of keywords: Personalized Medicine, Health Technology Assessment, Clinical Trial Agreements.

**Objective\*** (**Maximum 300 characters including spaces**) Provide a one sentence statement of the objective of the abstract.

**Method\*** (**Maximum 300 characters including spaces**) When, where, and how was the study done? What materials were used or who was included in the study?

**Results\*** (**Maximum 2000 characters including spaces**) What quantitative data was collected; what answer was found to the research question; what did the study find? Was the tested hypothesis true?

**Conclusion\*** (**Maximum 2000 characters including spaces**) State what can be concluded from the study and its implications.
